## **TIPS FOR A MORE MEANINGFUL CHRISTMAS**

- plan ahead by holding a family meeting to decide what the group really wants to do and who is going to do what
- if you need a symbol for giving in addition to Jesus and the Wise Men learn about St. Nicholas
- avoid debt refuse to be pressured by advertising to overspend
- avoid stress . give to yourself . dong assume things have to be the same as they expense.
- draw names rather than everyone giving something to everyone else in your giving circle. set a ceiling for each recipient. give children one thing they really want rather than many gifts
- give appropriate gifts . know the recipient and give what they need not what you want to buy
- celebrate Advent for four weeks before Christmas
