Urgent Need for Parish Refugee Family

For the past number of years Holy Rosary Parish and the Basilica of Our Lady have been working in collaboration to help bring a Refugee family to Guelph. The Government has now approved the family to come to Canada and they will arrive **THURSDAY MARCH 16, 2023**. Holy Rosary Parish and the Basilica have procured a house in the city, but the house will not be available for the family to move into for 2-3 weeks of their arrival. **THE PARISH NEEDS TEMPORARY HOUSING**.

The Council is asking if a family or families of the parish or a parishioner might be willing to provide temporary housing in their home for at least TWO members of the family for 2-3 weeks. The family consists of 6 members. A mother and father, two sons, a daughter and her child. We would be seeking three temporary homes for them. Is there a family or families in the parish who might be willing to take the Mother (Anastasia) and Father (Augustin) in their 60's, another family to take two sons, one of whom is finishing high school 18 years old (Samuel) the other in university 23 years old (Patrick), and a family willing to take a daughter 29 years old (Marie Claire) and her small child 5 years old (Michael). The family is from the Congo. They have lived in a refugee camp in Zimbabwe for over 20 years. This is their opportunity to come to a new land and new life.

Can you help us find for them temporary housing for 2-3 weeks. Please contact Fr.
