

Solemn Crowning of Our Lady

On Saturday, October 1st, our parish was honoured in a very historic manner, as the image of Our Lady, which has sat atop the High Altar for over a century, was solemnly crowned.

After Bishop Crosby declared the Basilica of Our Lady to be the Diocesan Shrine of Our Blessed Lady on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception in 2019, he petitioned the Holy Father in Rome to grant us the honour of having a crowned image of Our Lady in the Basilica. Thanks be to God, the Holy Father granted this honour, and with the gracious assistance of His Eminence Arthur Cardinal Roche, a beautiful crown was sent from Rome to honour Our Blessed Mother, and this Basilica. The crown, made by Savi Brothers in Rome, is gold-plated, and adorned with pearls and aquamarines.

At a very well-attended ceremony on our final Marian Day of 2022, the following proclamation from the Holy Father was read to the gathered congregation from across the Diocese:

To The Chancery at Hamílton, Ontarío, Canada

At the request of the Most Excellent Lord David Douglas Crosby, Bishop of Hamilton, in a letter dated 12 November in the Year of Our Lord 2019, by virtue of the particular faculties assigned to this congregation by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, we gladly grant, in the name and by the authority of the Supreme Pontiff himself, that the gracious image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is venerated in the Basilica of Our Lady Immaculate in Guelph, may be crowned by a precious diadem, assuming no objections whatever to the contrary.

From the offices of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, on the 8th day of December in the Year of Our Lord 2019, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Robert Cardinal Sarah, Prefect and Archbishop Arthur Roche, Secretary

Bishop Crosby responded to the proclamation with the following words:

My brothers and sisters, through the gracious permission of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, we have come to crown this image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This ceremony reminds us that the greatest in the kingdom are those who serve with love. Our Lord himself came to serve and not to be served, and Our Lady was the humble servant of the Lord when she was on earth. Now, in the glory of heaven, she is still the God-bearer who cares about our salvation; and is for us the minister of half and the Queen of law.

After Bishop Crosby blessed the Crown, it was taken in solemn procession through the Basilica, before Deacon Quinto took it by lift to the top of the High Altar, and laid the Crown on the head of Our Lady as the Choir sang a beautiful setting of Mary's great hymn of praise, <u>The Magnificat.</u>

We thank God, Pope Francis, and Bishop Crosby, for this wonderful honour, and we look forward to many more years of honouring Our Lady here in our Basilica, the Diocesan Marian Shrine.

At each meeting, the group enjoys a potluck dinner and social time to catch up with each other and get to know newcomers, followed by a discussion of a particular book, essay, or encyclical.

Over the course of the meetings so far, twenty-five young people have attended at one time or another, from the Basilica and other nearby parishes. The group includes several newlyweds and engaged couples, and also single young people. The group has also gathered for social events and to attend Compline in the Crypt. It has been impressive that, despite the busy lives that people lead, so many have made time to attend the group on a regular basis, and have shared how much they enjoy it.

This year, the reading selections have included 'The Four Loves' by C.S. Lewis, books from the Narnia series, excerpts from G.K. Chesterton and Flannery O'Connor, and encyclicals (Rerum Novarum and Humanae Vitae). It has been a unique chance to talk with people in the same stage of life, who are facing similar challenges, and together to dive deep into Catholic ideas about family, work, relationships, and the great gifts of the Church.

The group really looks forward to the potluck and social time, just as much as the book discussions themselves. It has been a great way to welcome newcomers to the parish and those who have been attending Mass but have had trouble meeting people. St. Vincent de Paul Society – Making a Difference to People in Need

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul volunteers are involved in many initiatives throughout the year to support those in need in our community, and we are grateful to receive support from the Basilica of Our Lady Parishioners to support the various initiatives.

How do we support those in our Community?

Through our Vinnie's Table, we offer breakfast every weekend throughout the year to the homeless. Vinnie's Table delivers homemade sandwiches, fresh fruit, bottled water, and juice to those staying in the city's emergency shelter - the Stepping Stone. From May until Thanksgiving weekend, however, Vinnie's Table is situated on the loggia where the small statue of Our Lady is (off the stairs on Norfolk St), and from there we offer breakfast to anyone in need or living on the street.



In mid-August, we prepared 45 summer care packages that consisted of certain essential items to help those living on the streets. The care packages contained 21 items including; new t-shirt, new socks, hygiene products (soap, wipes, deodorant, toothpaste/ toothbrush, comb/brush, bandages, sunscreen, face/ hand cream) small flashlight, nail clippers, rain poncho, some snacks, a pen/marker, a small notepad or book, etc. The packages were delivered to the Guelph Community Health Centre, Stonehenge Therapeutic Centre, and the Stepping Stone Shelter.

In August, we had a clothing drive in preparation for the cooler weather. We invited the other St Vincent DePaul Conferences in the City to bring in clothing that would be appropriate to anyone spending night(s) at the Stepping Stone emergency shelter. The response from the other churches was outstanding.





During the Thanksgiving Weekend, we did a Warm Socks Drive in response to a request from the Stepping Stone shelter. Again, a tremendous response from our generous parishioners.



The Society of St. Vincent de Paul – Basilica of Our Lady Conference – works year-round to help feed, clothe, and console those less fortunate. With your financial support, this is what our volunteers have provided over the past two years:
